#### IN MEMORIAM

Women's Support Services recognized the 25 victims of domestic violence across the state of Connecticut at our annual community vigil, held in North Canaan last autumn. Over 50 community members, including representatives from the Salisbury School attended the commemoration.

#### **ANNOUNCING 'LA CASITA'**

Women's Support Services significantly expanded our options for emergency shelter and interim housing this year. 'La Casita', a stand-alone home, was made available by a long-time supporter for clients to rest, recuperate, and plan for their future. More than 50 generous supporters have helped furnish and supply the home. Now a cozy, safe place, 'La Casita' housed 16 clients, including 6 children, this past year.

WSS received an enormous amount of support for clients in transition. Barbara Berkovich donated beautiful handmade bags filled with toiletries and beauty supplies for our clients. Simple, thoughtful gifts such as these can mean a world of difference to a client who has fled their home, often with few personal belongings.

Staffing was another area of growth for the agency. Increased federal funding enabled WSS to hire an additional Advocate, shifting the portfolio of an existing Advocate to focus solely on working with clients in need of emergency shelter and housing. Expanding programs need a strong infrastructure to support them and WSS recruited a Director of Operations for the first time, bringing our team to a total of 12 staff members.

In March Women's Support Services officially moved from their home of two decades in Sharon to a new, larger office in Lakeville. A wonderful crew of helpers from Lime Rock Park donated their time to help WSS move into their new space. Thank you!!

### WELCOME TO OUR NEW HOME

WSS's new home at 13a Porter Street in Lakeville provides the agency a world of opportunity. With room for our growing staff, the first phase of renovation is complete and includes office space, a children's room, and a client counseling room.

Phase II will include meeting space, a kitchen, and a much-anticipated Community Room. This room will



enable clients and their families to regain a sense of normalcy - cooking a meal, doing laundry and homework - all in a safe setting where they can access services at the same time. This second phase of construction will expand our options for office space and also enable WSS to hold meetings, training workshops, and support groups on the premises.
