Spotlight on Project SAGE A is for Advocate

SAGE is an acronym standing for Support-Advocate-Guide-Educate. This article is the second in a four-part series highlighting each letter in the Project SAGE acronym and sharing how we as an organization fulfill our mission of creating social change to end interpersonal relationship violence.

We at Project SAGE support clients as they navigate challenging personal circumstances. Providing court support services to victims involved in criminal or civil matters is a crucial part of assisting our clients in feeling validated and heard. **Lisa** is our Family Violence Victim Advocate working with Project SAGE clients whose cases are being heard in Torrington Superior Court. Lisa addresses the specific needs of clients as they negotiate the intricacies of the legal system.

Our clients arrive at court after experiencing acute trauma. Court processes are often complex and unfamiliar. Without an advocate to help navigate the system, the experience can easily become overwhelming. As a Family Violence Victim Advocate, Lisa educates clients on judicial processes and acts as their liaison to the State's Attorney's Office. Lisa also assists with the often emotional process of writing and presenting a victim impact statement in court. Throughout the court proceedings, Lisa serves as a voice that amplifies the voice of the victim. To the client, Lisa is a resource, advisor, champion, and shepherd through what otherwise might be a daunting ordeal. According to Lisa, "As an advocate, I hope to be a beacon for victims of domestic violence as they work to reclaim their power."
